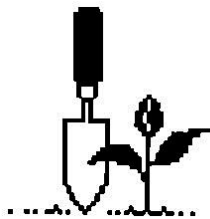

Plant Four Rows of Squash

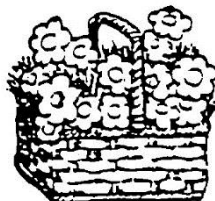
1. Squash Gossip
